On the 22nd of April, the world comes together to celebrate Earth Day, and this year's theme, "Planet vs Plastics," strikes a familiar chord in our hearts. Whenever we talk about the environment, I'm reminded of the enchanting world of Avatar. In the fictional world of Pandora, the Na'vi people nurtured an intimate bond with their environment, feeling its pain as their own and maintaining harmony amidst the flora, fauna, and elements.
