

Introductory note for the Diocesan Synod, 16 March 2024

To: Diocesan Synod members

Please find enclosed the agenda and papers for Diocesan Synod on 16 March at St Michael's Centre, The Green, Stoke Gifford BS34 8PD.

The Diocese of Bristol is continuing its journey through the *Transforming Church*. *Together* process and your contributions, perspectives, and experiences are essential for the synodical debates to ensure that the views of the people you represent are heard. We would therefore like to urge you to stay for the full meeting please, to ensure that the decisions made by Diocesan Synod are representative - and reflect the views of - its full membership and the wider Diocese.

This Diocesan Synod is largely formed of three parts:

- 1. **Routine Business:** This includes reports from recent meetings of Bishop's Council, Board of Directors, DMPC, and General Synod. Additionally, there will be an update on Bristol Diocese's progress toward Net Zero.
- Updates and Questions: This part features updates on Transforming Church. Together, Education, and Finance, with dedicated time for discussion and questions.

Our aim is to bring these items to Diocesan Synod so we can acknowledge the progress made, understand any concerns, hear your advice, and answer any questions. Furthermore, we want to showcase the extraordinary work of parishes as they continue to both expand existing initiatives, as well as starting new activities with the support of the TC.T programme.

3. **Diocesan Synod Elections:** Most importantly, the current Diocesan Synod concludes on 31 July 2024 and the new Diocesan Synod will run, for three years, from 1 August 2024.

We would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to you - the members of this Diocesan Synod - for your commitment and generosity in volunteering your time and expertise over the last 3 years. You have played a crucial role in advising, debating, questioning, and approving our highly commended new strategy and its early implementation. Without your prayers, and unwavering dedication and support, this would not have been possible.

As we approach the election for the next Diocesan Synod, we encourage you all to consider standing again, and to encourage others to join in. We are eager to fill any vacancies, and hope that individuals of all ages, genders, areas, backgrounds, and lived experiences will stand for election. Our goal is to ensure that the Diocesan Synod mirrors the rich diversity of the diocese, providing a platform for every voice to be heard, and to contribute to shaping our direction of travel. Your support in this matter would be highly appreciated.

Information on how to stand for Diocesan Synod election will be sent out via email later this month and will also be available on the Diocesan website.


Written questions
