Linking with your Cathedral

We are very excited to making stronger links with the Cathedral. The new Dean, Mandy Ford and the Education team based there are very keen to make sure that all schools understand that **the cathedral is a church for the whole diocese**. An enormous and special physical space that can wow children and all of us, but also a spiritual, community and civic centre for everyone in the diocese, whether practising Christian or not. So absolutely NOT just for local Bristol schools although they can have a fabulous relationship with the cathedral and its people.

The cathedral has a lot of city and national projects that happen physically or through conferences, talks and services. There are also Arts and cultural events, such as enormous moons, sculptures, and photo exhibitions throughout the year, so if you're visiting Bristol city, do drop by the cathedral. There is excellent parking and train, boat, and bus links nearby.

The Cathedral team are currently looking at ways to take the 'cathedral on tour' to schools so do look out for events in your local area in the new year.

Model Employment Documents
