


Background - Growing Faith Chaplaincy pilot

What is a Growing Faith Chaplain?

Christian Chaplaincy is a missional ministry focused on going out from the church, building relationships and sharing the love of God. Chaplaincy is therefore walking alongside people and constantly thinking, 'what does love require here'. This expression of interest has been designed as an enabling tool for parishes to think through and articulate where

the opportunities to develop Chaplaincy for under-18s might be in their context. Chaplains could be ordained or lay, working part-time or full-time. This is designed to be an inclusive process of mutual discernment: there is 'no one-size-fits-all' model. Please contact sarah.wattley@bristoldiocese.org to discuss this further.

Growing Faith - Evidence consistently points to the connection between three spheres of children's lives, where there are opportunities to growth faith.



Our current thoughts for the Growing Faith Chaplain pilot is to create chaplaincy roles which intentionally facilitate opportunities to engage children and young people in a missional way, acknowledging that Chaplains are guests in the communities they serve. It is also important to ensure there are opportunities to explore and grow faith including pathways for discipleship for those who want to know more. Exactly how this looks depends on your context — What does the surrounding

community look like? What is the culture, the demographics, the geography, the current terrain of opportunities to engage with children, young people and families?

The big pink circle represents that broader context of community. Community has a diverse meaning. Some might think of community as a geographical footprint. Perhaps others think of those communities such as the uniformed organisations – Guiding and Scouts. There are many expressions of

community and all can be included in this model.

Creating roles for Growing Faith Chaplains is one way in which we believe we can engage with children and young people and facilitate flourishing and faith opportunities. The vital element to engaging young people is a desire to connect with them, a sense of them being a priority within ministry and a plan for growing faith and discipling young people. These posts are missional roles, focused on meeting children, young people and families where they are and building relationships. Whenever we do this, we do so as part of the Messio Dei, always challenging ourselves to notice what God is already doing.

What will happen next?

- 1) Parishes/groups of churches work together to populate the information below
- 2) This is filled in on the electronic form or a downloaded version and emailed back to under 18s@bristoldiocese.org and sarah.wattley@bristoldiocese.org by 18th February.
- 3) Expressions of interest will be read and you may be contacted for further information in February.
- 4) The process of discerning pilot areas will happen during March and all those who have filled out an expression of interest will be contacted in this time. The Diocese is piloting a discernment matrix (grid) to guide the decision on the pilot areas.
- 5) Once pilot areas are selected the Diocese will support the development of Chaplaincy roles that meet the needs of those in the community, ensuring that young people's voices are leading the direction.
- 6) The Diocese will support the recruitment and training process. The model of employment (e.g. employed by local parish, employed by the diocese) is still being decided and will reflect the needs expressed by pilot areas.

The whole process of the EOI is a pilot aiming to balance direction and autonomy. Please feed back to us, in grace and love, if we can improve this process for the future.

Preparing to write your expression of interest

We know that every church is on a unique journey. There are certain things which we believe will help the process of planting a Growing Faith Chaplain in your area. This expression of interest is part of a pilot processes of working together to create context specific chaplaincy roles for children, young people and families. We have kept the title Growing Faith Chaplains to ensure consistency with the TC.T strategy during this time, however this could be changed.

Can you show:

- 1) A commitment to put children and families at the centre of church life evidenced through
 - a. a vision statement OR
 - b. a strategic plan/mission action plan (however this is termed) OR

c. examples through what you are already doing.

- 2) Existing relationships or opportunities that could be grown for example,
 - a. a relationship with a school/schools/community group OR
 - b. a need for support in the community. I was recently told about an initiative which developed to address community concerns around vandalism. It was acknowledged that this may be happening as a result of young people having nowhere to go, no space to be and lets face perhaps being bored. What does love require here for those young people? What does love require where you are?

If you don't have existing relationships with schools (Church of England, community, academy, SEN in all its diversity, special units, other learning institution, such as home education networks) and would like to explore how you could build these, please contact Sarah via under18s@bristoldiocese.org

- 3) How many hours you envisage this role being* we do not expect a job description to be developed, as this will be the next stage of the pilot, however it would be helpful in the expression of interest included for example,
 - a. you may have discerned that a one-day-a-week role within a school context, undertaken by someone with an existing relationship in the school, would be the model for your church.
 - b. you may think of a role that involves partnering with other churches. Perhaps you're thinking about a multifaceted role covering a larger geographical area?

*the key elements of these roles remains the missional focus of meeting people where they are.

- 4) Consideration of financial stability and planning for example,
 - a. do you have a plan for how the role might be sustained going forward whilst maintaining Parish Share?*

*the expression of interest form will ask you about future sustainability.
